DISTRICT ASSEMBLIES – REPORTS AND NEWS

General Superintendent, Dr Jesse C. Middendorf, presided at District Assemblies held, 25th-26th March in *Morley, Yorkshire*, and 28th March in *Belfast, N. Ireland*. Regional Director, **Dr Gustavo Crocker**, took part, preaching and bringing devotions. And the **Power of One** *"Resurrection Power - Easter to Pentecost"* devotional journey, produced by the Regional Church, was promoted at both assemblies.

At the South Assembly incumbent District Superintendent, **Rev David Montgomery**, was elected with a unanimous vote, and two were elected to *Elder's Orders* – **Rev Helen Lawson (Sheffield)** and **Rev Sarah Derck (NTC/PhD Student)**.

The North Assembly, held in the *Megain Memorial Church of the Nazarene*, *Belfast*, featured a weekend of Conventions and special services, and there were three ordinations: Rev Ruth J. Turner (Elder – *Larne*), Rev David M. Schnitter (Elder – *Carrickfergus*), Rev Colin I. McConkey (Deacon – *Bethany*). Rev Colin H. Wood brought his final report after serving as District Superintendent for nearly 19 years, and Rev Philip McAlister (*Carrickfergus*, and *North Europe Field Strategy Coordinator*) was elected District Superintendent on the 3rd ballot.

At both Assemblies there was a spirit of celebration and thanksgiving to God for the blessings of the past. And renewed vision and optimism were evident as the Church of the Nazarene in the UK moves forward in the Power of the Spirit into the year that is ahead of us.

LIVING STONES . . . a challenge from Rev. Philip McAlister, District Superintendent

In a garden, recently, I saw a stone that accurately predicts the weather. Engraved on the stone are these words, "If the stone is wet it is raining. If it is white it is snowing. If it is warm it is sunny. If it is missing someone has stolen it." The Apostle Peter tells us that we are living stones. What words should be indelibly marked in the stones that attend our churches? One word comes to mind – fellowship.

Fellowship is more than attending Church — it is assimilating into the body of believers, becoming part of a worshipping, loving, caring and sharing community. 1 John 1:7, reminds us that fellowship is not an optional matter for believers. It says, "If we walk in the light (in fellowship with God) this causes us to have fellowship with one another." The result is, "the

blood of Jesus, His Son, cleanses us from all sin". Fellowship and cleansing are related through the blood of Jesus. If a body part is severed from the flow of blood that part will become infected. Spirituality will be hindered without continual circulation of the blood. For the blood of Jesus Christ to have its continual cleansing effect in us we must remain attached to Christ's body.

1 John 2:10 "Anyone who loves their brother and sister lives in the light, and there is nothing in them to make them stumble." This shows that there is a strong, inseparable relationship between fellowship and loving the brethren. Fellowship is intended to be the practice of loving the brethren, which helps keep us in a right relationship with Christ.

Rejecting fellowship leads us away from the Body. A famous preacher once said "show me a professing Christian who seldom attends Church, and I'll show you a backslider who needs to get their heart right before God." How much love do you have for other believers in the church? Jesus said that the world would recognize our faith by the way we love one another (John 13:34-35). It is essential for every believer to be an active part of a Christian community. Willful rejection of fellowship can be evidence of not walking in the light. Fellowship is critical to our continued survival as Christians. We need the preaching and teaching from God's Word, the atmosphere of worship and praise, the encouragement that we draw from our other believers, the opportunities of Christian service, and we need the opportunity to practise love toward other Christians. Get involved and stay in faithful fellowship with the body of Christ! Don't run off if something disappoints you.

I think a Christian stone could have these words on it. "If the stone is wet it is crying and someone needs to show it compassion. If it is white and fresh someone needs to disciple it. If it is warm someone needs to gain from its warmth. If it is missing someone needs to go and find it."

"And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching. For if we sin willfully after we have received the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins" (Heb. 10:24-26)



The completion of this project is dependant upon the construction of a stair-tower to be built at the North end of *Hurlet Hall* for which funds are needed.


