Challenge for an Olympic Year

It seems incredible that another year has gone by and we are another year nearer our Lord's return. It seems 2012 will be an exciting year with the 200th anniversary of the birth of Charles Dickens, the Queen's Diamond Jubilee, and the Olympic games in London.



Thinking of 2012, a number of our churches are looking at having an 'Olympic' theme to their children's clubs, youth groups, and outreaches, to coincide with the 'games'.

Thinking of scripture, one gets the feeling that the Apostle Paul was no stranger to the 'games', indeed, a cursory look informs us of three things.

Firstly, he wants to run a good race. 'You were running a good race. Who cut in on you and kept you from obeying the truth?' Galatians 5:7 (NIV). His point is in relation to circumcision, but overall about us not being justified by the law. Rather we live by faith. 'The only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love' Gal 5:6 (NIV). The good race, is faith expressing itself through love. May our actions this year reflect our love rather than our anger or annoyance. Run a good race.

Secondly, he wants to run in such a way as to get the prize. 'Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize' 1 Corinthians 9:24 (NIV). He is encouraging us to be like the athletes who train and exercise in such a way as to be thoroughly prepared to run and win. In like fashion he tells us he makes his body subservient to his goal. His goal is to win as

many as possible (1 Cor 9:19). Rather than our goals being sacrificed on the altar of self, may our bodies serve the goal of making Christlike disciples in the nations.

Thirdly, he wants to finish the race. In the books of Acts and Timothy, as the end of his life draws near, Paul's thoughts are on finishing the race. Not content with just competing, the goal is to finish. 'However, I consider my life worth nothing to me, if only I may finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me—the task of testifying to the gospel of God's grace' Acts 20:24 (NIV). May we be consistent and persistent and finish well.

May God fill us, encourage us, and guide us as we run the race in such a way as to win the prize.




Global Wesleyan Alliance


GWA founder members include the, Church of the Nazarene, Wesleyan Church, Free Methodist Church (USA), Church of God (Anderson), Churches of Christian Union, The Evangelical Church, Evangelical Methodist Church, Congregational Methodist Church, Church of Christ Holiness, Missionary Church, and the Pilgrim Holiness Church. These 11 groups represent some 4 million members. (The Church of the Nazarene is also a member of the World Methodist Council which represents approximately 75 million members).

Celebrating the Past

Adwick le Street is located a few miles to the north west of **Doncaster**, S. Yorks. A Holiness Mission was established there in the 1930's and in the 1950's a hall was built on Church Lane. It became a part of the International Holiness Mission, and one of the early leaders was **Pastor Fred Carlile**, the father of **Rev Maurice Carlile**. A few years following the union of the IHM with the Church of the Nazarene in 1952, **Rev Maurice Carlile** was to follow in his father's footsteps, and become pastor. As a boy **John Jones** had been taken to the Holiness Mission, and he eventually became Church Secretary, and then for some 40 years he was the pastor. Many will remember the faithfulness and commitment of **Pastor John Jones** – leading the work, starting Sunday School Camps, organising senior adult house parties. **Pastor John Jones** passed away in 1997.

Although a small band of faithful members continued the work, and not least. **Hadyn and Susan Jones** - the son and daughter-of-law of **John Jones** - the church held its final service on Sunday 18th December 2011 – celebrating, and giving thanks to God for, approximately 80 years of ministry and witness in that community.

THE NAME LIVES ON



The Holiness work in *Blantyre* (birthplace of missionary **David Livingstone**) began in 1907. Originally called the *Blantyre Holiness Mission*, and in 1910 the *Blantyre Pentecostal Church*, the work became a part of the *Pentecostal Church of Scotland* uniting with the *Pentecostal Church of the Nazarene* in 1915.

After many years of meeting in the original hall, a new church, on Elm Street, was built and officially opened and dedicated on Sunday 24th October 1982. For nearly 100 years the witness was maintained in *Blantyre*; a ministry that concluded on Sunday 24th September 2006. The church was officially closed in its centenary year 2007.

The fine building on Elm Street was sold to **StAndrew's Church of Scotland** whose church is adjacent to it, and named, by the Church of Scotland, "**Nazarene Hall**".

The name lives on – and the work of making Christ known in that community continues. The *Nazarene Hall* is used every day of the week...for youth and children's work, for Sunday School and community groups. We are glad, and we give thanks to God, that the sacrifice and investment of those involved in our work in *Blantyre* over the years, is still bearing fruit.

THE WAY WE WERE

David Morrell reflects on children's work 'then' - and the challenge facing us today.

Gloucester, 1780...crowded slums, unemployment, many living in "work houses", children misbehaving, and society broken down. However, there was a man with a vision who believed that something had to be done. His name was Robert Raikes and he was a Christian. He believed that the answer to the problem was to try to prevent bad behaviour rather than cure it, and so he turned to education.

I am sure that **Robert Raikes** prayed much, but there was action as well...he recruited helpers and 'Sunday School' was born. And over the years Sunday School has become an important part of the work of the church, to reach and teach children, and to reach and teach adults, so that people of all ages can know God and grow in His grace,

In 1954 I became a Sunday School teacher in the *Ashton* church. As I sought for God's guidance and will for my life I was clearly led to the work of the Sunday School. Beside my secular work, it became my life. I became local editor of the then *National Sunday School Union (NSSU)* newsletter, and sought, by all means, to win children for Christ. Programmes included, a train-spotting club, film shows, tent campaigns. In 1957 my pastor, **Rev Jack Ford**, gave me a book called, "*The Boy Catcher*" and this book inspired my wife, **Sylvia**, and me to do even more... and we organised Sunday School holiday adventures in places like *Llay, Shanklin, Chester, Marple*. We sought to follow the example that had been set by **Robert Raikes**.



David Morell was chair of the *South District Sunday School Board* (1978-1994) and is a member of the *Dewsbury* church.

The question is, how similar is our society today to that of **Robert Raikes'** day? Is a new movement and a new passion needed to meet the challenges of today? There are problems in society, but I believe that if we can recapture the *Jov of Mission* then the Church, and Society – and the Kingdom – would greatly benefit.

Over the past few years when I have been out speaking I have offered, free, a set of books on the work of Sunday School – especially to younger Christians – on condition that they use the books and pray about being involved in the work among children. I continue to make this offer as I believe that God is calling people to commit themselves to this task.



In Memoriam

Margaret Roseline Trump went to be with the Lord on Christmas Eve, 24th December 2011, after a short time in hospital. She was 80. Originally from *Cornwall*, and with a background in the *Methodist* church, she met former Salvation Army Officer, **David Trump**, who was engaged in evangelist campaigns in the county, and following their marriage the **Trumps** enter the ministry of the Church of the Nazarene.


For some 35 years **Rev David & Margaret Trump** shared in ministry in a number of churches on both districts, including **N. Ireland**, and they have been active in retirement years in interim ministry and pulpit supply, eventually moving to **Larne, N. Ireland**.

In recent years **Margaret Trump** suffered from failing eyesight and a diabetic condition and during these years she was lovingly supported and cared for by her husband. She was always positive and bright and maintained a great interest in the work and life of the church.

Peter Wallace Gentry was called home, after a short illness, on 5th January 2012. He was 86. Originally from *London*, **Peter Gentry** had a career in Insurance...and he became a *Fellow of the Institute of Accident Assessors*. And this enabled to him to pastor some churches as a bi-vocational pastor; churches that would have difficulty paying a full pastor's stipend.

Married to Frances, the Gentry's pastored churches in *Bath, Hazel Grove, Bristol (Southmead), Port Glasgow, Weston-super-Mare* and *Southampton* over a period of 34 years. Peter Gentry served the church faithfully, and was a member of many District Boards, including the District Advisory Board, the Board of College Governors, and he served as District Secretary.

A man with a good mind and a gift for writing, **Peter Gentry** not only embraced the experience of holiness, he developed an interest in the theology and history of the holiness movement, particularly of the 18th Century. He authored a number of monographs and books, and was, for eleven years editor of *The Flame* magazine, succeeding Rev Maynard G. James in 1985. And he was an active member of *The Wesley Fellowship*.

Peter Gentry wrote, "His Touch" (Beacon Hill Press, 1980), "The Songs of Christmas" (Grace Wesleyan Trust, 2000), "The Wonder of Wesley" (n.d) and he co-authored, with **Paul Taylor**, "Bold as a Lion" – a book about John Cennick the Moravian Evangelist (Life Publications, 2007). His most recent publication – published early last year by The Wesley Fellowship - is entitled Methodism and Messiah, which examines possible links between Methodism and the composer George Frederic Handel.

A congregation of nearly 120 attended a service to celebrate the life of **Peter Gentry**, held on Thursday, 19th January, in the **Weston-super-Mare** church. Led by the pastor, **Rev Barry Hall**, others taking part included, **Rev David Thirkell**, **Rev Warren Tranter**, **Steven Dowle**, **Rev Tony Tamburello**, **Dr Philip Weatherill**, **Major Norman Armistead** (*Salvation Army* and editor of *The Flame*) and **Rev Colin H. Wood** (former North DS).

Our thoughts and prayers are with Mrs Frances Gentry and the two daughters, Kathy & Mary, and their families at this time.





The **Irons**, and their home church, have been involved, through Work & Witness projects, in the refurbishment programme. **Jerry & Cynthie Bishop**, also from the **Dodge City Church**, who helped coordinate the project, were also present.

And sincere thanks are also expressed to **Don & Bonnie Irons** for establishing two scholarships to help support research students from the non-western world. **Dr Kent Brower**, *Vice Principle (Research)* comments, "...many of our EU and N. American students study part-time, taking advantage of flexible residency requirements. But many international students do not have access to the necessary academic

resources in their home contexts, and so full-time in Manchester. where resources readily available, is the best option for them. These new scholarships will help to make this possible, and help resource the church in parts of the world where it is growing most swiftly."

Saturday, 12th November 2011, was a day of praise and rejoicing in Mozambique. Nearly 400 gathered in Jantique for the opening of The Mavangane District Centre, which was dedicated in memory of UK missionary, Rev Frank Howie.

Approximately £10,000 was committed to this project, which was promoted by Rev Trish Laird, (pastor of the Largs (Scotland) church and former missionary to Africa). And it was the Largs church that bore the burden of this project and where many fund raising activities were held. In addition to the contribution made by Largs, the project has been supported by, Alabaster Funds, Souter Charitable Trust, Maputo & Xai Xai Districts (Mozambique), North District NMI...and by individuals.

It was in Jantique that the very first Church of the Nazarene was planted in 1922...and in the dedication service the following statement was made:

"Rev Frank Howie began his missionary service here in *Mozambique* in 1964 and served in this capacity until his death in 1993. For his dedicated service to the Lord we dedicate this church to his memory and as representative of all the missionaries who left their home countries and have given of their lives to spread the Word of God throughout Mozambique."

Rev Trish Laird preached the dedication sermon, and others taking

part in the service included, Rev João Guidione Bucuane (District Superintendent) and Rev Dr Paulo Moisés Sueia (Field Strategy Coordinator). Today the work of the Church of the Nazarene in *Mozambique* is organised into 5 Areas, and there are 30 districts.

Rev. Frank Howie 1938+1993

Rev Frank Howie was born in Belfast. He was converted and became a Nazarene under the ministry of the late **Rev Bert Kelly** in the **Donegall Road** Church of the Nazarene. Following training at Hurlet Nazarene College and British Isles Nazarene College (BINC), and pastorates in Belfast & **Blantyre**, he was ordained, in 1962, by General Superintendent, **Dr Hugh C. Benner**. It was while he was at BINC that he met Heather, a nurse, who was also training for missionary service. They were married in 1961.

The call to the mission field came through the ministry of Rev Norman & Joan Salmons – Nazarene missionaries in the Tete Province of Mozambique. The need was for a missionary couple...a preacher and a nurse, and the Howies fitted the bill perfectly. After acceptance by the Missionary Board and language study in *Portugal*, the Howies, and their two children (who had been born in *Blantyre*) arrived in Mozambique.

Although the Howies service in Mozambique was made difficult, and interrupted, by unrest and

political change, much was accomplished over the years...with Frank Howie serving in various positions including, head of the *Tavane Mission Station*, advisor to three districts, director of Extension Bibles Schools, and Mission Director. The situation in the country eventually meant that the **Howies** had to reside in S. Africa, where they were active in evangelism among the *Mozambique* migrant workers living in the Republic, while maintaining contact with the work in *Mozambique*. Eventually visits became possible and Theological Education by Extension became a priority, and Frank Howie translated books, wrote books, and sought out books already written in Portuguese, for this purpose. He had a great love for pastors and the training of pastors...he had a heart for young people, challenging them to go into full time Christian service.

Frank Howie was a born preacher - from his teen age years - and he continued to preach in English, Portuguese and Shangaan, up to his untimely death in 1993. He was 55.

Heather Howie, who lives in Brough, East Yorks, comments, "...the new Mavengane District Centre...will be a great blessing to the people. Frank would have been very humbled to think that it was a building dedicated in his name."



WOMEN IN MINISTRY

Celebrating 100 years of Women's Ordination in the UK

Conference Dates: 11th-13th May 2012

This conference has been arranged to commemorate the centenary of the ordination of **Olive Winchester** in *Parkhead*, Glasgow, on 11th May 1912. A member of the 'Winchester Rifle' family, **Olive Winchester** was a graduate of *Harvard University*, gaining a BA degree in 1903 (specialising in Hebrew and Arabic), and she came to *Glasgow* in 1909 to enrol in *Glasgow University* to study for the second degree of Bachelor of Divinity...the first woman to do so.

The 3-day *inter-denominational* conference is being sponsored by four main partners: the University of Glasgow School of Critical Studies, International Christian College (Glasgow), Nazarene Theological College (Manchester), and Sharpe Memorial Church of the Nazarene (Glasgow). Conference venues are Glasgow University, International Christian College, Sharpe Memorial Church, Parkhead.


The purpose of the conference is three-fold:

25 Years of Ministry


