Rev Raymond Spence

Rev Raymond Spence was called home late on Sunday, 22nd January. He was 88. Originally from Hartlepool, Raymond Spence trained for the ministry at Beech Lawn Bible College. In the early 1950s Pastor Spence and Rev John Crouch conducted a campaign in Ballymacarrett, Belfast, and Raymond became the first pastor of the new church in 1951. He became engaged to Phyllis McCleland of Belfast and Dr George Frame

Superintendent). The vacancy was created by the conducted the wedding in 1954. Ordained in 1955 by Dr Samuel Young (General Superintendent) other ministry assignments followed including, Barlanark (Glasgow), Carlisle, Sheffield, Bournemouth, and Bolton First. For 12 years the Spences' pastored churches in Canada (Niagara, Ontario, and Trenton, Nova Scotia). Retiring to Lurgan, N. Ireland Rev Spence was involved in and supported the work of the church at Lurgan and on the Ulster Zone for these past 20 years. Rev Spence was in the full time ministry for some 45 years. Nearly 200 attended the Service of Thanksgiving held on Saturday, 28th January, in the Lurgan Church, conducted by Pastor Jim Fugard, at which many tributes were brought, including family tributes from son Ken, and son-in-law Rev Ian Fitzpatrick (DS of Canada Central). We remember Phyllis Spence and the family...one son and four daughters...in these days.



Jeanne McGonigle passed away Sunday morning, 5th February, after a lengthy illness. Jeanne met Pastor Herbert McGonigle in London and they were married in 1961, and for 55 years she has been a support and encouragement as a pastor's wife in Walthamstow (London), Uddingston, and Leeds (Dewsbury Road), and as part of the family of Nazarene Theological College during the nearly 40 years, Dr McGonigle has been tutor, College Principal, and Principal Emeritus. NCM HOUSE MINISTRY



Faced with the need to address Mental Health and Suicide issues in the community and recognising the lack of services that are available, Stephen Cairns reports that a new ministry is being established at NCM House, Belfast. Isabel Hamill MBACP, MNCS, (who is a fully qualified counsellor, a member of professional bodies, trained in grief and trauma counselling, and is also a pastor's wife), is offering a new counselling

service. Isabel will offer an integrative approach that encompasses all aspects of counselling theories regardless of age, race, gender and religious affiliation. Problems such as anxiety, depression, relationship difficulties, and Mental Health First Aid will be covered. Isabel says, "...sessions will normally last for an hour and be non-judgemental, confidential, relaxed and in a safe environment where empathy, warmth and respect will be shown to all...counselling can be hard work, but I believe with the right attitude great things can be achieved".
