

EMMANUEL CENTENARY



The 100th Anniversary of Emmanuel Bible College was celebrated at this year's Drysdale Lecture held Monday 10th May 2021. This year's lecture took the form of a Zoom forum of discussion and contribution by a panel of practitioners chaired by Dr Julie Lunn and Dr Peter Rae. Founded in November 1920 in Birkenhead by Scottish evangelist, J. D. Drysdale and originally called 'The Missionary Training Home and Bible College', the character and identity of Emmanuel was marked by an emphasis on worldwide missions, a zeal for evangelism, and a passion for holiness. Over the years scores of young men and women have gone out from Emmanuel to serve the Lord at home and abroad.



In 1997 Emmanuel Bible College ceased operation and became an integral part of NTC and in 2004 the Emmanuel Centre, a new library and classroom unit, was opened to mark the transition.

Rev Ronald Edward Bean passed away 30th November 2020, age 81. Originally from Leeds, Ron Bean found the Lord as a 16-yearold through a Billy Graham film organised by his High School Christian Union. Ron studied Religious Education, English and History at the City of Leeds Training College obtaining a Certificate of Education, and a

teaching career followed at Westborough High School, Dewsbury, spanning some 23 years. Feeling a Call to Ministry, Ron became, for 5 years, associate pastor to Rev Ray Busby in the Dewsbury Church of the Nazarene. Pastorates were to follow in Carlisle (8 years) and Erskine, (5 years) before retirement in 2003. Ron had met Margaret Rogers at a National Young Life Campaign Youth Club and they were married in Leeds on 1st April 1961, and Margaret became Ron's help-meet and partner in ministry.

A Service of Thanksgiving for Ron's life and ministry was held in the Dewsbury Church of the Nazarene on Monday 14th December 2020 - participating clergy included, Pastor Joe Prescott, Rev Carl McCann, Rev Ken Prescott, and Rev Tony Musgreave. Ron was a good man, a genuine and sensitive Christian and a disciple of Jesus Christ, and we thank God for his life and ministry. He is survived by his wife Margaret, their three children, Michael, Elizabeth and David, and their families - 7 grandchildren and 2 greatgrandchildren.

Rev David Alexander Hamill passed away 24th January 2021; he was 57 and had, for the past 11 months, been receiving treatment for cancer. The Hamills commenced ministry at Belfast First at the beginning of 2012 and served over these past 9-years.

David had a pastor's heart and everywhere he went friendships were formed and his ministry appreciated. A Service of Thanksgiving for the life and ministry of Rev David Hamill was held on Saturday, 30th January 2021, in the Carrickfergus Church of the Nazarene led by Rev Philip McAlister.
