Pentecost is the fulfillment of prophecy. When the Apostle Peter addressed the crowd on the Day of "...AND YOU WILL BE MY WITNESSES..." (ACTS 1:8) Pentecost he declared,

'...this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people..." (Acts 2:16-17).

The inaugural signs that accompanied the giving of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost are of significance. The sound of the rushing mighty wind suggests power and enablement. As Jesus said to His disciples. "You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you." (Acts I:8). The tongues of fire speak of purity. And when the apostles met some time later at the Council of Jerusalem to recall the events of Pentecost, it was purity that came to their minds - "[God] put no distinction between us and them (the Gentiles), for he purified their hearts by faith." (Acts 15:9). The miracle of languages underlines the importance of proclamation – people need to hear and understand the good news of the Gospel. As the apostles spoke in other tongues the people said, "...each of us hears them in his own native language." (Acts 2:8).

What then, is the Paradox of Pentecost? Simply this, although the person of Pentecost is the Holy Spirit, the purpose of Pentecost is to glorify, exalt and lift up Jesus. Two verses are striking in this connection. When Jesus was teaching his disciples about the work of the Spirit and explaining to them what the Spirit's ministry would be, he said, "...he (the Spirit) will bring glory to me..." (John 16:14). And when giving instructions to his disciples to tarry in Jerusalem and wait for the gift the Father promised, Jesus said, "...when the Holy Spirit comes upon you...you will be my witnesses." (Acts I:8).

In his 'Pentecostal Sermon', recorded in Acts 2, Peter guotes the Joel prophecy and then proceeds to preach Jesus...his life and work, his death and resurrection. And the climax of his address is Jesus! "Therefore, let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Christ." (Acts 2:36).

The purpose of Pentecost is Christ and for us to be "his witnesses." As Raymond E. Brown expressed it..."the Paraclete (Holy Spirit) is the presence of Jesus when Jesus is absent." May the Holy Spirit fill each one of us...to enable us to be like Jesus...to know his presence, and to be his witnesses!





"GOD SAVE THE KING!" We are commanded to "...honour the King" (I Peter 2:17) and we are urged to remember in prayer those who have the rule over us: "... that petitions, prayers, intercessions and thanksgiving be made for all people - for kings and those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness." (I Timothy 2:I-2). We thank God for the Coronation of their Majesties, King Charles III and Queen Camilla, for the service of Christian worship and praise held at Westminster Abbey on 6th May, and pray that God would bless them and grant unto them compassion, integrity, understanding. and wisdom.

MINISTRY OF FOOD

It was in December 2012, during the ministry of Rev Geoff Austin, that the North Ayrshire Foodbank was established in the Ardrossan Church of the Nazarene as members of The Trussell Trust. Originally housed in the Church Gallery, the operation has, over the years, expanded and moved to the Church Hall. In addition, portacabins have been installed in the church grounds to hold the food-stock along with a new 'ramp system' to ease the flow of donated food.

In 2013 it was thought that the Foodbank would assist 350 households. By the end of the first year some it was actually 3,200 households. Over the years the Foodbank has raised 644.61 tons of food and issued 641.6 tons. Food has been distributed across North Ayrshire benefitting nearly 34,000 households which represents 43,881 adults and 17,686 children.

During the 2 years of Covid lockdown a number of innovations took place.

- Commercial grade kitchen installed.
- Over 48 tons of food issued in 2 weeks.
- 2000 meals a week distributed by Council Teams.
- Holiday programme "Make a Meal of it" for children.
- "Junior Chef" programme to teach healthy eating.

Other programmes have included issuing annually 250 festive hampers. thanks to the support of Community Windpower, and placing a hamper in each of the 290 temporary accommodation households over each Christmas and New Year period. Recent developments have included.

- A mini-shop 'Larder Project'.
- Employment of a Campaign Officer.
- Mobile cinema showing "Food for Film".
- 48 dedicated volunteers.
- Distributing food to I4 hubs across N Ayrshire.

In addition to the Foodbank, local pastor, Rev Nathan Payne, and Church Member George Bradford, operate a financial support programme in connection with 'Christians Against Poverty' and are able to give advice "Make a meal of it" annual pantomime. to those struggling with debt,



fuel poverty, housing issues and mental health. The Ardrossan Church is grateful for the generosity of many in terms of cash and food and the financial support from the North Ayrshire Council, and the BBC 'Children in Need' which funds the children's work. Thanks are also expressed to 'The Trussell Trust' for its support and for the grants which enabled the portacabins to be installed and the employment of the Welfare Rights

Officer and the Campaign Officer. Local Church Member and Coordinator and Manager, Chris Crosthwaite says, "...it has been an amazing time of blessings for all involved...and we thank God that so many are being reached with love and compassion."




