This Sunday I was grateful to learn more from John Packard about cornerstones! As well as his awesome Biblical knowledge, John has plenty of building experience too. When John and Vera were in Kenya working as missionaries, part of John's role involved constructing buildings. John was telling me about the crucial importance of the cornerstone. The cornerstone determines the measurements and orientation of the entire building. John told me that the slightest inaccuracy could cause the whole building to go wrong. John also explained that usually it wouldn't be until all the walls were constructed and work on the roof was beginning, that any mistake would be uncovered.

As Christians, Jesus is our cornerstone. When we take our focus away from Him however slightly we can convince ourselves we are doing just fine. But eventually we find ourselves completely out of alignment, with our lives in a mess. Paul reminds us in his letter to the Ephesians that Jesus is our personal cornerstone and also the cornerstone of the Church universal: In Him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord (Eph. 2:21). It is Jesus as our foundation and our alignment to Him, that causes the Church to have mighty, supernatural power.

This week we are delighted to welcome Rev Carl McCann back to our church. We always enjoy Carl's heartfelt and informative sermons. Since 2019 Carl has been District Superintendent of the Church of the Nazarene British Isles South District. We are so thankful for his leadership, support, and guidance. We continue to keep Carl in our prayers as he leads our district during these especially challenging times.

Next Sunday, Pastor Mick will be back with us. We pray that he, Debbie, and Mikey will enjoy the last few days of their holiday.
