"LET US RUN WITH PERSEVERANCE THE RACE MARKED OUT FOR US, FIXING OUR EYES ON JESUS, THE PIONEER AND PERFECTER OF FAITH." - HEBREWS 12:1-2.

There are many instances where the Apostle Paul uses the analogy of the Christian life being like running a race. As we look at the life and writings of Paul, we begin to understand the truth behind this metaphor.

Our journey of faith is not a 100-metre sprint—it is more like an endurance race. Think of it a marathon, or even an ultra-marathon. When taking part in a long-distance race, the runner needs to pace himself. Setting off at a sprint will inevitably cause the runner to burn out too soon. In Philippians 3 verse 14, Paul calls us to persevere, saying "I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus".

There can be many diversions in store for us as we navigate the roads along our personal race. Paul recognises this when he tells the Galatians in chapter 5 verse 7 – "You were running a good race. Who cut in on you to keep you from obeying the truth?" In our lives, both individually and as a church, it is vitally important that the we remain focussed on the task ahead and do not get sidetracked by worldly distractions.

There will be times when the race will be particularly hard. In long-distance running terms this is referred to as "hitting the wall". This is when Paul's message to the Hebrew people will become especially significant in our lives. When life is hard, when everything seems to be against us and we are at a low ebb, when we feel we are hitting life's wall, it is at these times when we need to fix our eyes on Jesus. I am reminded of the old chorus: "Turn your eyes upon Jesus. Look full in his wonderful face, and the things of earth will grow strangely dim, in the light of His glory and grace".

Paul understands the importance of the task ahead of us, declaring in Philippians 2:16 "Then I will be able to boast on the day of Christ that I did not run or labour in vain". And if we persevere until the end, with our eyes focussed on Him, casting distractions to one side, our reward will be "The crown that will last forever" (1 Corinthians 9:25).

These are the thoughts I'll be taking with me as I run my first (and probably my last) marathon on Sunday. I've trained long and hard, and I'm ready for what lies ahead. I am running to raise funds for The Alzheimer's Society, in memory of my father-in-law, Joseph Rowley, who suffered from the disease. Joe completed his earthly race and went on to receive the ultimate prize of the crown that lasts forever. I'm looking forward to receiving a medal and a free flapjack at the end of this particular race.

Sermon: The Bible—Don't just 'read' it

Scripture: Hebrews 4:12-16
