Important Church News about COVID-19

COVID-19: Guidance for the safe use of Places of Worship

The government has announced that England will move to Plan B in response to the risks of the Omicron variant.

What this means for places of worship

Face coverings

Face coverings are required by law in most indoor public places, including places of worship, and on public transport. Face coverings are not be required in hospitality settings such as cafes, restaurants and pubs. This is because it is not practical for customers to keep removing their face coverings to eat or drink. This means that in a café within a place of worship, face coverings are not required, but they are mandatory in the rest of the premises.

Steps everyone can take to reduce the risk of transmission

- *Anyone with symptoms of COVID-19, should not attend church. They should self-isolate immediately and get a PCR test.
- *If someone has been instructed by NHS Test and Trace to self-isolate because they have tested positive for COVID-19, or they are the close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, they must self-isolate and not attend.
- *Social distancing in a place of worship is now a personal choice. We ask you to respect other attendees and those working who may wish to adopt a more cautious approach.
- *Several simple and effective personal hygiene behaviours can also continue to reduce the risk of catching or spreading COVID-19. These include:
 - *washing your hands with soap and water or using hand sanitiser regularly throughout the day
 - *avoiding touching your eyes, nose and mouth, and washing your hands before and after if you do need to touch your face (for example to put on or take off your face covering)
 - *covering your mouth and nose with disposable tissues when you cough or sneeze, or sneezing into the crook of your elbow (not your hands) if you do not have a tissue

Social distancing and capacity

You do not need to implement social distancing. However, you may choose to limit the close contact you have with people you do not live with. This can help reduce your risk of catching or spreading COVID-19.

Singing

We would encourage everyone to continue to wear their face coverings while singing if they feel able to do so.

Other measures

The church will ventilate the church to the best of its ability. Surfaces will be regularly disinfected. Free face coverings will be available and hand sanitising gels will be readily available.

Please help us to protect those attending church from becoming infected with COVID-19.

Sermon: The Forgotten Characters of Christmas

3: The Genealogy of Jesus

Reading: Matthew 1:1-17

- 1. An account of the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah, the son of David, the son of Abraham.
- 2 Abraham was the father of Isaac, and Isaac the father of Jacob, and Jacob the father of Judah and his brothers, 3 and Judah the father of Perez and Zerah by Tamar, and Perez the father of Hezron, and Hezron the father of Aram, 4 and Aram the father of Aminadab, and Aminadab the father of Nahshon, and Nahshon the father of Salmon, 5 and Salmon the father of Boaz by Rahab, and Boaz the father of Obed by Ruth, and Obed the father of Jesse, 6 and Jesse the father of King David. And David was the father of Solomon by the wife of Uriah, 7 and Solomon the father of Rehoboam, and Rehoboam the father of Abijah, and Abijah the father of Asaph, 8 and Asaph the father of Jehoshaphat, and Jehoshaphat the father of Joram, and Joram the father of Uzziah, 9 and Uzziah the father of Jotham, and Jotham the father of Ahaz, and Ahaz the father of Hezekiah, 10 and Hezekiah the father of Manasseh, and Manasseh the father of Amos, and Amos the father of Josiah, 11 and Josiah the father of Jechoniah and his brothers, at the time of the deportation to Babylon.
- 12 And after the deportation to Babylon: Jechoniah was the father of Salathiel, and Salathiel the father of Zerubbabel, 13 and Zerubbabel the father of Abiud, and Abiud the father of Eliakim, and Eliakim the father of Azor, 14 and Azor the father of Zadok, and Zadok the father of Achim, and Achim the father of Eliud, 15 and Eliud the father of Eleazar, and Eleazar the father of Mathan, and Matthan the father of Jacob, 16 and Jacob the father of Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom Jesus was born, who is called the Messiah.
- 17 So all the generations from Abraham to David are fourteen generations; and from David to the deportation to Babylon, fourteen generations; and from the deportation to Babylon to the Messiah, fourteen generations.
