## **Brooklands Church Update**

## Sunday 6 February 2022

#### **Dear Friends**

"Be devoted to one another in love. Honour one another above your-selves."

Romans 12:10.

Around 57 AD the apostle Paul was in Corinth during his third missionary journey. It was here that he wrote his letter to the church in Rome. The book of Romans is one of the most beautiful and complex books in the Bible. The poet Samuel Coleridge called it "The most profound work in existence." In the early 1500s a German monk called Martin Luther was in turmoil over his sinfulness and brokenness. It was while reading Romans 1: 17 that Luther had a cataclysmic breakthrough that we are saved by faith alone. He recalled later he felt reborn, and he described this passage as a "gateway into heaven." Luther's work changed the church, and the world by bringing about the Protestant Reformation.

What I love about Romans is Paul's teachings on how Christians can live and worship together. The situation in the Roman church was complex with Jewish and Gentile believers struggling to co-exist. Paul wrote to remind them that they must love one another as they would their own blood-families. Love is central to the Gospel. It was Jesus' loving sacrifice that puts us back into a right relationship with God. By urging Christians to live in loving unity with one another Paul was demonstrating that we are the body of Christ. It is through the Church that God is pursuing the loving process of salvation.

Today, the work continues. The Nazarene Church is involved in missional and humanitarian work around the world. Healthcare, education, disaster relief, fighting slavery and helping refugees are just a few examples of how we demonstrate God's loving kindness. Last week we held a special collection for Lebanon and Cyprus. A big thank you to everyone for donating so generously. I am pleased to confirm we raised £830.

After our service this morning, we will be having our AGM. As a loving family working for God, we have a serious responsibility to make sure our church is run properly, and we are being faithful to God's plans for us. Everyone is free to attend but only members can vote. If you are interested in becoming a member, please speak to Pastor Mick.

Deeper 3

1 Corinthians 2: 6-16

6 We do, however, speak a message of wisdom among the mature, but not the wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are coming to nothing. 7 No, we declare God's wisdom, a mystery that has been hidden and that God destined for our glory before time began. 8 None of the rulers of this age understood it, for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. 9 However, as it is written:

"What no eye has seen,
what no ear has heard,
and what no human mind has conceived"—
the things God has prepared for those who love him—

10 these are the things God has revealed to us by his Spirit.

The Spirit searches all things, even the deep things of God. 11 For who knows a person's thoughts except their own spirit within them? In the same way no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. 12 What we have received is not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may understand what God has freely given us. 13 This is what we speak, not in words taught us by human wisdom but in words taught by the Spirit, explaining spiritual realities with Spirit-taught words. 14 The person without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God but considers them foolishness, and cannot understand them because they are discerned only through the Spirit. 15 The person with the Spirit makes judgments about all things, but such a person is not subject to merely human judgments, 16 for,

"Who has known the mind of the Lord so as to instruct him?"

But we have the mind of Christ.
