Brooklands Church Update Sunday 20 February 2022

We are lifting our eyes beyond ourselves this week and our Update introduction comes from Sylvia Cortez, wife of a Ukrainian District Superintendant. Here she sheds some light on the tensions from her own perspective. Let's remember them in prayer.

These are truly strange days. Despite the hyped-up news in the west, people in Kyiv (Kiev) still carry on as usual. The stores are well-stocked, and there is no rioting or looting. We have witnessed no panicking. Part of the reason for this is that the war with Russia has been ongoing for 8 years and the threats / bullying is a normal part of Ukraine-Russia relations. Some people are in denial about the situation, but most just refuse to be paralyzed by fear. They have lived through so much political struggle in their lifetime, they will just deal with it as they have in the past. The west might show concern and hit Russia with sanctions, but there is a real sense that we're really on our own over here.

I am now receiving daily messages from the US Embassy (3 today alone) recommending that all Americans leave immediately for fear of a Russian invasion at any moment. Rumours are that Russia will attack Kyiv, the capital city, with missile strikes. We live 1.5 miles from the city centre, so you can pray this never happens.

While nothing has happened yet, Ukraine's economy is already getting hit. The dollar is rising daily. Investors are leaving. So even if nothing happens, the propaganda has worked to weaken Ukraine. Undoubtedly, psychological warfare has long been at play and it's working both here and abroad. The church has really been affected by this since 2013. Because of the ongoing political tension and war in the east, Ukraine has received few volunteers, and it's been years since we've seen a Work & Witness team (though we did have a virtual team with the Netherlands district last fall).

Almost all of our American friends have left. We know very few Ukrainians who have left or travelled abroad, and fewer who would be able to even if they wanted. Ukrainians are beautiful, proud people who love their land and will do anything to protect it. So, we all wait together. Hoping for the best and preparing for the worst.

- * Please pray for peace. No one in Ukraine wants war. And casualties on both sides would be devastating.
- Please pray that we will be able to see the needs as they arise in case of an attack, and the means and people to respond.
- * Please pray for protection in case of a violent attack.
- * Please pray that people remain calm, in prayer, and together.

Deeper 5

Hebrews 6:13-20

¹³ When God made his promise to Abraham, since there was no one greater for him to swear by, he swore by himself, ¹⁴ saying, "I will surely bless you and give you many descendants." ¹⁵ And so after waiting patiently, Abraham received what was promised.

¹⁶ People swear by someone greater than themselves, and the oath confirms what is said and puts an end to all argument. ¹⁷ Because God wanted to make the unchanging nature of his purpose very clear to the heirs of what was promised, he confirmed it with an oath. ¹⁸ God did this so that, by two unchangeable things in which it is impossible for God to lie, we who have fled to take hold of the hope set before us may be greatly encouraged. ¹⁹ We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure. It enters the inner sanctuary behind the curtain, ²⁰ where our forerunner, Jesus, has entered on our behalf. He has become a high priest forever, in the order of Melchizedek.
