Dear friends

Today is Palm Sunday, the day where we commemorate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem and declare him, again, as king in our lives. It is also the first day of the final week of Lent, also known as Holy Week. Holy Week marks the final leg of our journey with Jesus on the road to the cross and to help us with this our Lenten resource provides a Scripture reading for prayer and meditation each day this week - there are still some left in the sanctuary if you don't have one or have lost it.

Also, Holy Week holds a number of special days with significant meaning - Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Black Saturday. This Friday, at 10am, we will hold a short Good Friday service where we will reflect specifically on the crucifixion of Christ. Please join us if you are available.

A reminder that on Saturday we will be joining with other churches in Wythenshawe for an Easter trail. It takes place in Wythenshawe Park between 12-4 and should be brilliant for families looking for an interactive Easter event. We will be participating in leading so please be in prayer for the impact of the event. Then on Sunday we will celebrate the Resurrection with a family time of worship including baptisms, testimonies and welcoming new church members. I am very much looking forward to it and hope you are too!

Reading: Luke 19:28-42

28 After Jesus had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. 29 As he approached Bethphage and Bethany at the hill called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 30 "Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. 31 If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' say, 'The Lord needs it.'"

32 Those who were sent ahead went and found it just as he had told them. 33 As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?"

34 They replied, "The Lord needs it."

35 They brought it to Jesus, threw their cloaks on the colt and put Jesus on it. 36 As he went along, people spread their cloaks on the road.

37 When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen:

38 "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!"

"Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

39 Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!"

40 "I tell you," he replied, "if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out."

41 As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it 42 and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace—but now it is hidden from your eyes.
