Easter Day

Good morning! It is with great pleasure that I welcome you to church on this Day of Days, Resurrection Sunday. We will begin our time of worship with a greeting that will be spoken in congregations the world over today,

My dad remains poorly also...

Jim's death has had me reflect on the truth of this season. I've spoken before about the complex nature of my family but despite all of this - the good and the painful - Jim's faith in the faithfulness of Christ, particularly in recent weeks, meant that he faced death comforted with the promise of resurrection.

MATTHEW 28:5-6

You are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said.



Those of us left behind still mourn, of course, but we do not grieve like the rest of humanity (1 Thessalonians 4:13). We mourn Jim's absence for now but we look forward to being reunited with him. All of this captures the essence of the Easter truth as we proclaim with the Apostle Paul:

"Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" 1 Corinthians 15:55

Death still stings, but the sting has been removed in the knowledge that, because of Christ, and because of the events of that glorious Easter morning, death will not have the last laugh!

Christ is Risen, Alleluia!


