Additionally in this passage we have two very interesting characters to psychoanalyse - Jesus, and Peter the disciple who emerged as leader of the early church.

On Tuesday we had the funeral of our dear brother in Christ, John Beattie. Among the tears and sadness there was laughter and happiness. It was a celebration of John's faithfulness, kindness and intelligence. As we'll discover in our sermon being steadfast in our identity as Christians, is of crucial importance. John's identity as a person-in-Christ shone out for all to see. His faithfulness and holiness never wavered. We continue to uphold Anne and all the family in prayer. We thank God for John's life, the blessing he was to us, and that he has returned to glory.

This is the time of year when students get their GCSE exam results, and we congratulate them all on their achievements over what has been a difficult time of learning. We would especially congratulate Antony Armett on an excellent set of results. It is a testament to his hard work and resilience that Antony finishes this phase of his education with five grade 9s (the highest grade possible), three grade 8s, and one grade 7.
