"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son" John 3:16.

I'm sure you are familiar with this verse, even if you are new to church and Christianity. It has often been cited as the one verse of the Bible that captures the whole Scriptural narrative in a single sentence. However, we tend to think of the cross and resurrection when it comes to mind, I think.

But if the cross and resurrection are the culmination of this then we must think of the Christmas story as the beginning of its fulfilment. At Christmas we are reminded that God has come to us in his Son. The giving of the Son to be with us is motivated by one key characteristic of who God is: Love. Today we light the fourth candle of Advent, the candle of Love.

The candle will be lit by one of the three(!) families in our church who contain four generations. This is a beautiful reminder that not only does the truth of the Gospel go out, but it also travels down through families in love. What a wonderful thing to ponder and celebrate.

And how better to celebrate this than to give primacy of place in our service to our children as they lead us in telling the Christmas story. I know they have been working hard in all their preparations and we look forward to them leading us in worship in this unique and special way.

We are also delighted to be hosting the Manchester Gospel Choir who will perform some pieces for us at the beginning of the service.

Another 4 generation family celebrate a significant milestone in the church. John and Vera Packard mark 70 years of marriage on Monday. Following church this morning we will enjoy cake to mark the occasion.

Remember our carol service is tonight at 6pm where we will read and sing through the Christmas story as well as finish off our Advent preaching series with, "Advent: a Time to Love."

Next Sunday is Christmas day. We have arranged for a short gathering at our usual time of 10.30am. We will mark the birth of Christ with a family gathering. I look forward to seeing you there.


Prayer Points

This Week's Sermon (Sunday evening) – Mick Kane A Time to Love – Matthew 1: 18-25

18 This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. 19 Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

20 But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. 21 She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

22 All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: 23 "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us").

24 When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. 25 But he did not consummate their marriage until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.
