



"Then a great and powerful wind tore the mountains apart and shattered the rocks before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake. 12 After the earthquake came a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire. And after the fire came a gentle whisper. 13 When Elijah heard it, he pulled his cloak over his face and went out and stood at the mouth of the cave." – 1 Kings 19:11b-13

I've been continuing to think about Lauren's message to us last week from the famous story of Jesus calming the storm in Mark 4. Her three points came to us very prophetically: rest, trust and faith. I laughed to myself as some of the feedback particularly appreciated the brevity of her message (point taken! Lol!). I'm grateful for Lauren and the way she has settled in with us here at the church. Continue to pray for her ministry to children, young people and families.

What remained with me throughout all of last week was that first point – rest. The disciples find themselves in the midst of a storm which must have been so significant as it unsettled seasoned fishermen who would have been very familiar with the weather patterns of Lake Galilee. And yet, at such a time of crisis where do we find Christ: napping! This is a key promise to us around how we too can find rest even in the most troubling of times.

As such I thought we would continue to explore a theme of 'finding God in unexpected places.' This morning we will look at the famous passage of Elijah on mount Horeb. God shows up, but where? But How? God tends to work outside of the realms of our expectations.

I'm grateful too for Lucy who is going through a season of discerning her calling with the Church of the Nazarene this weekend. I've had the privilege or writing her reference and I am reminded again of the gift she is to us as a church. Let's hold her in prayer in these days.

We have been intentional about developing a team approach to leadership here in the hope that we model a community approach to care, support and ministry in the wider church. I know that it is not without its challenges but I remain convinced it is a Christ given model.

Unfortunately we have had to cancel our Winter Warmer Vaccine Drive on the 26th January due to a clash of dates for many of the organisations who were partnering with us. Thank you to those of you who were willing to distribute leaflets for us. We will find other ways to continue to bless our local community.
