
# BROOKLANDS CHURCH

As we continue on our Minor Prophets series this week into the book of Micah, we see above familiar language where God is described as a shepherd to his people. Micah is another challenging book of judgement on the people of God who have turned away from Him and face the devastating purposes of such. But all is not lost! Like many of the prophets, hope lies on the other side of judgement as God's love for his people overshadows his anger.

As we work to finalise the church accounts for the financial year we wanted to share some good news with you. By far the biggest project we undertook this year from a monetary perspective was the purchasing of new chairs in the sanctuary. We needed to create further capacity as we were almost full – what a great problem to have! There is of course a cost to projects like this. But we are pleased to report that due to the generosity of your giving, which raised £4,350, as well as some individual legacies, totalling £10,000, the cost of the chairs was almost entirely covered – all that needed to come out of the general fund was £236!

We want to thank you for your generosity, and give glory to God! A detailed breakdown of our accounts will be made available at the AGM but in the spirit of accountability to you, the board wanted to let you know about this now.

As I mentioned last week, we want to have a donation drive ahead of winter for the local food pantry (which runs out of the church on Thursdays) and the local food bank (which runs out of Sandilands Primary School, also on Thursdays). As such, we will be accepting donations as part of our worship service next Sunday. Please see below a list of items that have been requested. If you are in a position to do so, please bring donations next Sunday and leave them at the front of the church.

Finally, please note that the Tuesday evening Bible Study, and Wednesday's Toddle In will not meet this week due to half term. Both events will be back on the following week.

#### SUNDAY 22 OCTOBER 2023 MICAH 7:1-20 - MICK KANE

- I What misery is mine! I am like one who gathers summer fruit at the gleaning of the vineyard; there is no cluster of grapes to eat, none of the early figs that I crave.
- 2 The faithful have been swept from the land; not one upright person remains. Everyone lies in wait to shed blood; they hunt each other with nets.
- 3 Both hands are skilled in doing evil; the ruler demands gifts, the judge accepts bribes, the powerful dictate what they desire—they all conspire together.
- 4 The best of them is like a brier, the most upright worse than a thorn hedge. The day God visits you has come, the day your watchmen sound the alarm. Now is the time of your confusion.
  5 Do not trust a neighbor; put no confidence in a friend. Even with the woman who lies in your embrace guard the words of your lips.
- 6 For a son dishonors his father, a daughter rises up against her mother, a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law—a man's enemies are the members of his own household.
- 7 But as for me, I watch in hope for the Lord, I wait for God my Savior; my God will hear me.
- 8 Do not gloat over me, my enemy!
  Though I have fallen, I will rise. Though I sit in darkness, the Lord will be my light.
  9 Because I have sinned against him, I will bear the Lord's wrath, until he pleads my case and upholds my cause.
  He will bring me out into the light; I will see his righteousness.
- 10 Then my enemy will see it and will be covered with shame, she who said to me, "Where is the Lord your God?"

- My eyes will see her downfall; even now she will be trampled underfoot like mire in the streets.
- 11 The day for building your walls will come, the day for extending your boundaries.
- 12 In that day people will come to you from Assyria and the cities of Egypt, even from Egypt to the Euphrates and from sea to sea and from mountain to mountain.
- 13 The earth will become desolate because of its inhabitants, as the result of their deeds.
- 14 Shepherd your people with your staff, the flock of your inheritance, which lives by itself in a forest, in fertile pasturelands. Let them feed in Bashan and Gilead as in days long ago.
- 15 "As in the days when you came out of Egypt, I will show them my wonders."
  16 Nations will see and be ashamed, deprived of all their power. They will put their hands over their mouths and their ears will become deaf.
- 17 They will lick dust like a snake, like creatures that crawl on the ground.
  They will come trembling out of their dens; they will turn in fear to the Lord our God and will be afraid of you.
  18 Who is a God like you, who pardons sin and forgives the transgression of the remnant of his inheritance? You do not stay angry forever but delight to show
- 19 You will again have compassion on us; you will tread our sins underfoot and hurl all our iniquities into the depths of the sea.

20 You will be faithful to Jacob, and show love to Abraham, as you pledged on oath to our ancestors in days long ago.
